HOW IT WORKS

How to Register to Vote: September 17 annually marks National Voter Registration Day. National Voter Registration Day is a nonpartisan civic holiday dedicated to celebrating our democracy. Since its kickoff in 2012, the honorary day has worked to get **over 5 million Americans** registered to vote in time for their next trip to the ballot box.

To vote in this year's election within the state of New York, future voters must be registered by October 26, 2024. Future voters can register in person at any local or county Board of Elections, online or via mail.

Voters who have moved recently should update their voter registration to match their new address.


